Introductory word

2018 marked the start of the new phase of development of the Institute of Analysis and Advocacy, as the team chose a new executive director, a new board of directors, coordinated a new strategic direction for IAA for the next 3 years.

Realizing the importance of the role of think tanks and their influence on the formation and policy implementation in Ukraine, in 2018 we have worked hard to develop our own analytical capacity, service continuity, partnership expansion, communication and positioning.

The IAA team focused on research on health, public finances, procurement, good governance, and social affairs. Aware of the need for changes in the medical sector, we expressed our analytical and communicative support for medical reform.

Sharing the opinion on the need to improve the quality and practice of public policy development in Ukraine, we explored the possibility of public funding for policy analysis. As a result of the research and discussion, there were recommendations that would contribute to the development of the market for analytical services in Ukraine, where the main customer of the policy analysis should be the state and its institutions.

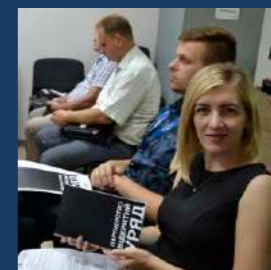
Developing ourselves, we developed others. We provided about 500 consultations and conducted 12 trainings in support of institutionalization of the ProZorro system, carried out 25 trainings for 250 listeners in the field of organizational and program development. 7 Budget Advocacy School were held for 120 representatives of the non-governmental community of Ukraine and Kyrgyzstan.

Combined our efforts and promoted the development of organizations and coalitions for the sake of change at the local level.

By defending the principles of transparency and accountability of government institutions, taking care of our own - we received the highest result in the international rating of financial transparency of the Transparify think-tanks - 5 stars. Only 67 think tanks in the world have such an award.

Conscious of our own responsibility for keeping the reform course in a 2-year-old election period contributed to the development of critical thinking through the established channels of public journalism "Tribuna Poltava" and "Tribuna Sumy".

And although a lot of meaningful steps were taken in 2018, there are still many important events and challenges ahead. But despite all, challenges are new opportunities. Therefore, moving forward confidently!

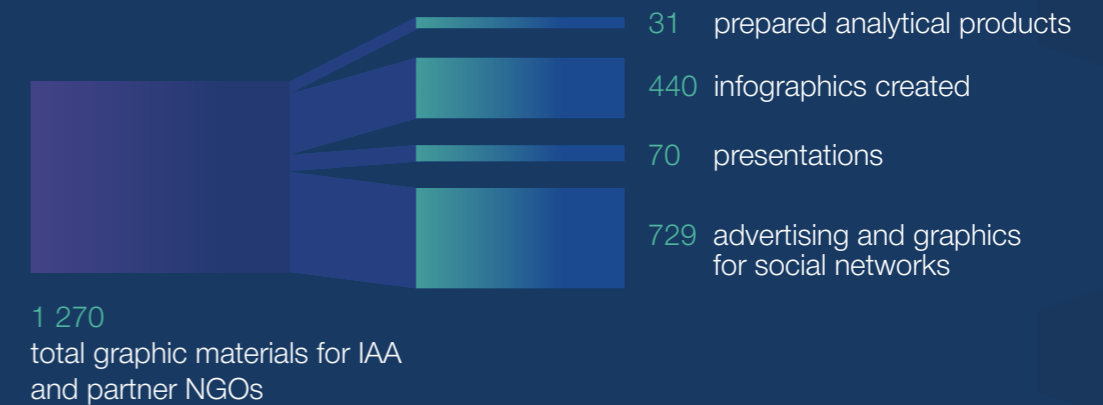

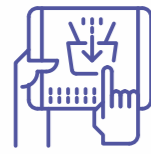

Local purchases of medicine - control and response

Goal: to ensure compliance with the legislation on public procurement and to promote healthy competition at bids in different regions of Ukraine through the working groups of the appeal

Geography: Kyiv, Poltava, Odesa, Kropyvnytsky, Ivano-Frankivsk region

Achievement: The [methodology of joint work](#) on the appeal of procurement at the local level was developed.

[Five regional response centers](#) for public procurement have been created.

[1000 healthcare purchases](#) at the local level were verified.

[2 videoinfographics](#) were created about DoZorro possibilities of searching and analytical work.

According to the results of the monitoring, violations were detected and [91 complaints](#) were filed, of which 39 appeals to law enforcement and controlling bodies.

[18 responses](#) to directed appeals were received.

[10 responses](#) and interactions with Customers, law enforcement and controlling bodies are described.

An [analytical report](#) on the effectiveness of procurement of health facilities in the monitoring regions was formed. [Recommendations](#) for eliminating deficiencies in the appeal system have been developed and forwarded to the [Ministry of economic development and trade of Ukraine](#).

[100 appearances in the media](#) to highlight the results of monitoring and appeal procedures for public procurement.



Research of procurement of energy services

Goal: to study the procurement of energy services by budgetary institutions in order to further improve the legislation and energy service module in the ProZorro system

Geography: Ukraine

Achievement: Cooperation was established with the Department of Construction, Urban Development, Architecture and Housing and Communal Services of the Poltava Regional State Administration - a [Memorandum was signed](#) to facilitate the study.

[408 energy service procurements](#) were monitored.

The [survey and focus group](#) of state customers and energy service companies representatives were conducted on deficiencies and possible ways of their elimination in the process of procuring services of the energy service.

The public discussion of legislation on the procurements of energy service and energy service areas was held.

[Policy brief based on the results of the study](#), includes the existing proposals for improving the current situation was created.

A [public presentation](#) of the [policy brief](#) among the target groups was conducted as a result of the study.





Increasing the transparency and integrity of repair and construction of roads in the Poltava region

Goal: to increase the transparency and integrity of the repair process in the Poltava region from the stage of procurement planning to the stage of implementation of the contracts

Geography: Poltava region

Achievement: The monitoring specialists processed **105 purchases of services** and repair works in the Poltava region.

11 trips were carried out (2 of which with the participation of a technologist engineer and specialist of the State Enterprise "Local Roads Agency in the Poltava region"), during which over 40 road sections with a total length of 694 km were inspected, of which 48 km were repaired.

The findings identified during the roadside **inspections were documented**, inspection materials are transferred to the relevant agencies, this information was provided to contractors to address identified deficiencies.

Formed policy brief, which includes the results of procurement monitoring, roadside survey and proposals for optimization of procurement procedures for road works.

With the participation of the representative of the SE "Local Roads Agency", UNDP focal point on the SDG (SDG - Sustainable Development goals approved at the UN Summit in 2015), customers and the media held a round table, on which the results of the survey were presented.



Formation of reporting and data processing models in the field of opioid analgesics

Goal: development of models and strategies for the improving of the data collection and reporting system for the dispensing of narcotic analgesics at the interregional and regional levels.

Geography: Ukraine (except temporarily occupied territories)

Achievement: A round table was held at the Ministry of Health for the presentation of the results of the study on the consumption of opioid analgesics in Ukraine for 2010-2015.

An **expert group** on reforming the sphere of circulation of narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances and precursors was formed.

The main directions of the problem solving were determined and the **Strategy for the reform** of the sphere of circulation of narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances and precursors was developed.

An **advocacy team** has been formed to implement the strategy of reforming the circulation of opioid analgesics in Ukraine.

Presentation of the report on the results of the study and the Strategy for the reform of the drug circulation sphere in Kyiv with the participation of representatives of the Ministry of Health, the International Renaissance Foundation and the advocacy team.



Regional monitoring and analysis for the Network 100% of life

Goal: to direct the analytical capacity of NGOs for ensuring access to treatment for people living with HIV through public monitoring and control over the rational use of funds in the health care system during planning and conducting procurement.

Geography: Ukraine (except temporarily occupied territories)

Achievement: 6 monitoring hubs were created.

There are **more than 2,800 purchases** from the DoZorro community that have negative reviews or violations.

More than 500 appeals have been sent to the supervisory authorities regarding the violations detected.

Involved in the work on the price list of **10 specialists** from the regional representations of CO "100% Life".

More than 41 thousand items of prices for medicines were introduced to the analytical module "Price Guard".



Think tankers in HealthLink

Goal: to facilitate the access of PLWH and vulnerable groups to quality treatment through the development and use of analytical, advocacy, and media potential of regional PLWH departments.

Geography: Ukraine

Achievement: The methodology for calculating the status of provision of ART-therapy for HIV-infected patients at the regional level has been updated.

Under the coordination of the IAA, regional NGOs conducted an **analysis of the availability** of HIV drugs in 2017 in **6 regions of Ukraine**.

An **analysis of provision of test systems** for HIV / AIDS in 2017 in 12 regions of Ukraine was carried out - a **report was generated**.

In order to establish the level of provision of ART in the regions, developed a **special methodology**, which determined the **state of availability of drugs in the drug treatment** facility during the year. Such a detailed analysis was made possible by establishing cooperation with the for Public Health Center, which provided all the necessary information.

Based on data obtained from the study, an **advocacy strategy was developed** to increase access to counseling and free HIV testing for local budgets.

According to the violations detected during the monitoring of the effectiveness of public procurement violations, **5 investigations were conducted**, documented materials published on information Internet resources. Such investigations have created a precedent for further systematic cooperation with journalists in revealing violations detected in procurement.

On September 20-21, in Kyiv, a **Coordinating Stakeholder Meeting** was held on the implementation of the transition plan of HIV / AIDS programs to state funding. Participants in the discussion were key stakeholders such as the Public Health Center of the Ministry of Health of Ukraine, CO "100% Life", USAID Ukraine, UNAIDS, the International Renaissance Foundation. In total, **more than 100 people attended the meeting**.



Monitoring and public dialogue with local authorities on the implementation of medical reform in the Poltava and Sumy regions

Goal: to evaluate the process of implementation of medical reform in the Poltava and Sumy regions and to consolidate representatives of local authorities, physicians, and public activists on its quality implementation in the context of the Law of Ukraine "On State Financial Guarantees of Medical Care of the Population" in view of its compliance with the provisions of the Association Agreement.

Geography: Poltava and Sumy region

Achievement: The [monitoring and comparative analysis of the prerequisite campaign](#) for primary care physicians at different levels of local government, as well as the process of autonomy of the health care institution and contracting with the National Health Service of Ukraine in Poltava and Sumy regions was conducted. Analyzed the financing of medical incentives on the ground.

Among the representatives of the authorities and medical workers, a [sociological survey of local incentives was conducted](#), the gaps were identified in the first steps of implementing local reforms, and the compliance of local regional programs in the area of healthcare with the provisions of Chapter 22 of the Public Health Act of the Association Agreement with the EU.

[Formed a vision](#) (a set of proposals) for the Poltava and Sumy regions to overcome the gaps in the first steps of implementing local reform and possible measures for its more effective implementation.

[Public discussion on the implementation of medical reform](#) in the Poltava and Sumy oblasts was started with the participation of representatives of civil society organizations, physicians, CSO experts, community representatives in the format of round tables.

The results of the study are summarized in the [policy paper](#).



Monitoring the effectiveness of using budget funds in Poltava

Goal: to monitor the efficiency of using budget funds by the executive committee of the Poltava City Council.

Geography: Poltava city

Achievement: [The data on the state of the city budget](#) for 2017 and first half of 2018 were collected. The amount of planned budget expenditures; the amount spent and not spent in 2017 funds; the amount of additional needs and management that lacked budget funds; priority areas of financing of the city economy; the amount of savings on purchases has been set.

[A sociological survey was conducted](#), 624 respondents were polled, which allowed to evaluate the level of awareness about the size of the city budget and satisfaction with the efficiency of using public finances.

[A comparative analysis of the amounts](#) of approved funds to actual expenditures, savings and the possibility to establish ineligible expenditure items has been carried out.

[The results of the study](#) are summarized in the [policy paper](#) and distributed in public.

[Public discussion «Urban Budget Expenditures: Analytics vs Sociology?»](#) was held with the participation of representatives of the Poltava City Council, the budget committee, non-governmental organizations.



Identify the main channels of communication between people of respectable age and local self-government bodies

Goal: to establish ways of connecting people of respectable age with local self-government bodies and their frequency of use

Geography: Vinnitsa, Lviv, Melitopol, Mirgorod, Sumy, Cherkasy, Chernihiv

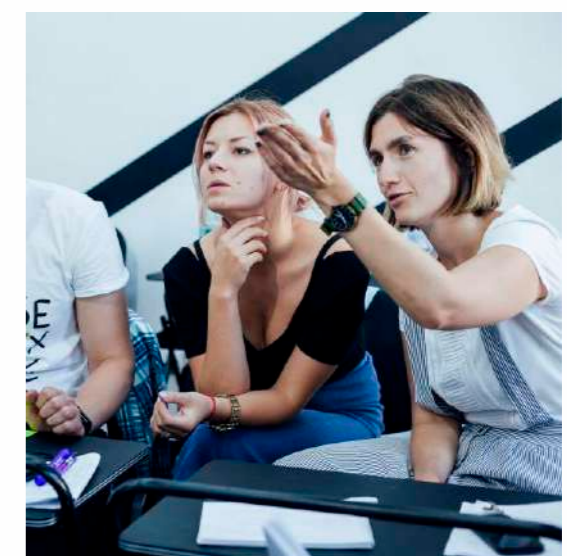
Achievement: A research was conducted that consisted of two components: sociological and analytical. Additional statistics on the demographic situation in selected cities and the distribution of population by age group were used.

The **level of communication** quality between local authorities and people of respectable age was determined, as well as the main difficulties that arise in the process of cooperation.

There are common ways to improve the **level of communication** between Local authorities and people of respectable age through training, which is to improve computer literacy and internet skills, studying the tools of citizen participation in government decision making and online communication.

The distribution of indicators of the activity of adding people of respectable age of the studied regions in community life and decision-making of the local authorities, in particular by sending appeals, submission of projects to the participative budget, is established.

The results of the study are summarized in the **policy paper**, which also includes a number of suggestions that can improve the quality of communication between people of respectable age and local authorities. Among them there is training for people of respectable age and local authorities, more informing people of respectable age about ways of participation in community life and improvement of legislation in the context of the elderly people.

Public funding of non-state think tanks

Goal: to develop a concept for improving the system of state funding for research in order to further enhance the capacity of think tanks in obtaining budget funding for research

Geography: Ukraine

Achievement: A public discussion was held with the participation of representatives of non-governmental organizations, think-tanks, government officials, the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, etc., which presented the report "State funding for research for non-governmental think tanks", discussed the main results of the study and outlined the ways of improving the system.

The concept was formulated with a clear list of necessary changes to the laws and regulations, which should be implemented in order to improve the possibility of public funding of analysis.

An information campaign was carried out to popularize the ideas of demonopolization of research funding among the population.

Laws and regulations projects have been prepared, the adoption of which will ensure the implementation and establishment of procurement and financing mechanisms for policy analysis.

The videoinfographic was developed, in which in a multiplicative way the results of the conducted research are presented and proposals for improvement of the system are developed.

A round table was held with the participation of representatives of public organizations, the Directorate of the Ministry of Justice, think tanks and experts in the field of procurement, public finance.

The proposals on improving the system of state financing of analysis for the budget funds were discussed.

A press conference with a live broadcast on the national level was held - the issue of research funding, scope, and prospects for involving think tanks in policy analysis was updated.



Sustainability of harm reduction component in regional HIV / AIDS epidemic programs

Goal: expert and advocacy support for NGOs working in the area of harm reduction at the local level.

Geography: Cherkasy, Odesa, Sumy, Poltava, Rivne, Zaporizhzhya, Kropyvnytsky, Lviv, Kyiv, Vinnitsa regions.

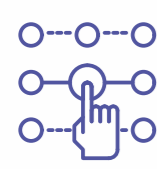
Achievement: Planned, budgeted and allocated funds from local budgets that are needed to implement local components of the transition plan for harm reduction.

During 2017-2018, more than UAH 22.5 million from local budgets was allocated in the direction of providing sustainability of harm reduction services. That testifies to the established policy of responsibility of local authorities in the direction of the response to the epidemic.

A base of documented cases of successful advocacy at the local level in the area of ensuring the sustainability of HIV / AIDS epidemic services was created.

Harmonized normative acts of the national and regional level in the Public Health Center, in accordance with the chosen strategy of ensuring the sustainability of services.





Introducing mechanisms for transparency and accountability at the local level

Goal: to increase the level of transparency in the use of public finances and to improve local instruments for citizen participation in decision-making at the local level.

Geography: Poltava region

Achievement: The level of implementation of the instruments of public control and participation of citizens in making decisions on the possibility of their use by ordinary citizen as a result of the conducted research was established.

A training seminar "Anti-corruption tools: how to control power at the local level?" was held.

In the structure of the All-Ukrainian Coalition "Transparent Councils" there were 2 public organizations from Poltava.

The advocacy of the "open budget" visualization system (openbudget.in.ua) and its modules has begun.

The adoption by the Myrhorod City Council of the Procedure for the publication of information on the activities of utility companies was announced.

21 appeals to administrators and recipients of budget funds were sent in order to comply with the provisions of the Law "On the Openness of the Use of Public Funds".

The monitoring of implementation of the "Regulation on data sets to be made public in the form of open data" was approved by the resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine dated October 21, 2015, No. 835, and directed to the pilot cities with a view to publishing a complete list of data sets.

9 articles with elements of analytics were created, 4 TVs and 1 radio broadcasts were held, discussing the possibilities of public monitoring and control of public procurement.

The monitoring of procurement by local authorities was carried out and 21 appeals to customers, controllers and law enforcement agencies were sent. According to the results of the appeals administrative protocols were drawn up on the responsible persons who were sent to court, the consideration of cases on anti-competitive concerted actions was started, the mistakes in tender purchases were corrected.

6 journalistic investigations were conducted on the basis of public procurement monitoring.



Countering the informal fees of patients in health care facilities

Goal: to counteract forced gatherings of patients in obtaining medical care through the introduction of transparent and accountable mechanisms of charity in Poltava health care facilities.

Geography: Poltava city

Achievement: The monitoring of the current situation with the collection of charitable donations in the Poltava hospitals and analysis of changes that took place with the entry into force of the Order of the Ministry of Health No. 848 "On Measures to Control the Receipt and Use of Charitable Donations in Health Care Institutions" was conducted.

A policy memo was drawn up on donations collected by charitable foundations in the Poltava hospitals and the amount of funds transferred to hospitals for 9 months of 2018.

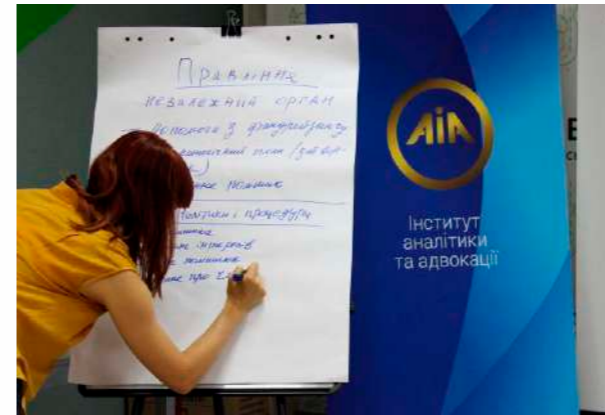
An information campaign aimed at actualizing the problem of patient informal fees among residents and deputies in particular was conducted.

Together with partner organizations and deputies of the Poltava City Council, the concept of the main measures that should facilitate the transparent collection of donations from patients and prevent the coercion of this phenomenon was developed and on the basis of which a draft decision has been developed.

Adoption by the Poltava City Council of the decision "On voluntary charity donations and strengthening measures to control their receipt and use in health facilities of Poltava" of November 30, 2018.

Budget Advocacy School

Goal: institutional development of the BAS and capacity building of civil society organizations that carry out activities in the areas of public health and budget advocacy in the countries of the region of Eastern Europe and Central Asia.

Geography: Ukraine and Kyrgyzstan

Achievement: Registered trademark "budget advocacy" for goods and services. Certificate number 251400 dated 10.12.2018.

The main policies and procedures that describe the functioning of the BAS and the regulatory processes of attracting new experts, organizing events were developed.

The formed BAS team, which included experts from the Institute of Analysis and Advocacy, CO "Light of Hope", CO "100 PERCENT OF LIFE", NGO "Club Chans", Transparency International Ukraine.

There is a constant filling of the Facebook page (120 publications, total coverage - 72,359 views), newsletter transmissions to international and Ukrainian NGOs (68 in Russian and English for 20 international non-governmental organizations and 39 all-Ukrainian NGOs).

The website BAS budgetadvocacy.ua was developed. Created YouTube channel and 6 own videos on it.

Documented, visualized and posted on the website 15 successful practices of budget advocacy of CO "Light of Hope" and the NGO "Institute of Analysis and Advocacy".

7 Budget Advocacy School for Communities of Ukraine and Kyrgyzstan were held:

- April 24-27 for the CO "Positive Women"
- June 23-27 for organizations working in the field of palliative care;
- July 2-5 for grantees organizations of the Soros-Kyrgyzstan Foundation (Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan);
- July 5-8 in Kyiv for representatives of the MSM community;
- July 10-13 in Kyiv for representatives of the TB community;
- August 13-16 in Odesa for representatives of the community of prisoners and released;
- November 20-23 in Kyiv for patient organizations in Ukraine

More than 120 representatives of non-governmental organizations went to the Budget Advocacy School.

The strategic support of the participating organizations in the advocacy activity for 2016-2018 allowed to attract UAH 23.8 million of budget funds for key activities in the HIV / AIDS, TB, and VHC response regions.

Participation of the BAS experts in the activities of the Strategic Group at the Ministry of Health of Ukraine, which coordinates the implementation of the transition plan in Ukraine.



Hub for the development and support of regional civil society organizations

Goal: to strengthen the institutional capacity of regional NGOs to strengthen their influence on the formation and implementation of government policies.

Geography: Poltava and Sumy regions

Achievement: The catalog of expertises and services that IAA can provide to regional NGOs of Poltava and Sumy regions was developed.

Provided educational and consulting support to 150 civil society organizations in Ukraine.

2 trainings for NGOs were held (Poltava - project management, fundraising, advocacy, PR and communication, Sumy - information design and communication).

Internships for NGO "European Club", NGO "Mart" were held.

The NGO base was formed in Poltava and Sumy regions, the distribution of the catalog of services and advising on organizational capacity was conducted.

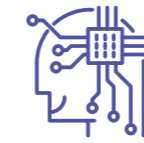
The expert potential of the IAA coaching team in conducting training activities for other NGOs has been increased - 1 ToT has been conducted (ToT - training for trainers).

Ensuring sustainable development of the think tank "Institute of analysis and advocacy»

Goal: to ensure sustainability and stable development of the organization by strengthening and diversifying the financial capacity of the organization; increasing the professionalism and expert potential of the organization through improving the quality of research, management and communication of the organization; improvement of the internal structure and policies of the internal organization management, ensuring their proper functioning.

Achievement: The level of effectiveness of the functioning of internal policies was monitored and determined. Based on the results of the assessment and the **conclusions drawn, internal policies and procedures** in the field of management and operational activities have been improved, optimized processes have been reduced to a single management guide for the organization.


The **catalog of examinations and services** on the topics of conducting analytical researches, which can be provided by the Organization on request, was developed.

An **annual assessment of staff** was carried out to assess the strengths and weaknesses of each team member and to **develop individual development plans**, which were followed by training of IAA experts.

Improved qualifications in the field of professional knowledge of **25 people at 55 training events**, in particular in the following areas: financial management, graphic design, PR and communications, public procurement in the Prozorro system, project management, etc.

Diversification of sources of IAA funding was ensured.

Membership in the organization has been **increased by 15%**.



The highest result in the rating of transparency of the Transparify think-tanks has been received - 5 stars. Such an award has only 67 think tanks in the world.

Improved IAA reporting and planning procedures. An **annual internal conference** was held, on which the IAA leadership, leaders of the directions of the IAA, and the board of the organization reported. The achievements for 2018, operational plans for 2019, strategy and communication strategy for 2019 were presented.

Online edition «Tribuna»

Goal: to increase the quality and impact of regional independent journalism in order to develop critical thinking in the population, as well as to provide information on current reform processes taking place in Ukraine.

Geography: Poltava and Sumy

Achievement: A series of medical materials was issued: 5 video interviews with leading specialists and authorities on issues of medical reform and myths surrounding its implementation; 12 analytical articles on health reform, palliative care, harm reduction and transparency and accountability.

There was established cooperation with NGOs working in the field of public health in order to strengthen the advocacy of the latter, 18 publications on key activities, achievements, activities carried out by organizations were distributed.

A series of journalistic investigations into violations and abuses in the procurement of medical institutions at the local level was conducted, 11 publications were published on the results of the investigation.

The staff of the Poltava edition created and produced over 3000 news materials, 105 of them on public health.

The editorial board of the Tribuna Sumy issued over 3,000 news articles, 357 articles on public health.

The processes of the editorial office of the Tribuna Sumy were normalized: standards, requirements and rules for the development and approval of materials.

The attention of the society to the problems of IDPs, ATO soldiers, volunteers and other citizens, which was affected by the conflict in eastern Ukraine (coverage of video films about 120 thousand), was intensified.

Prepared and released: 10 television microfilms, 10 video histories adapted for social networks, online platforms from the cycle "War. Reboot. «

Video stories have influenced the formation of positive public opinion on the importance of legal, economic, moral, psychological support for victims of conflict, the need for support of volunteers, soldiers and veterans ATO.

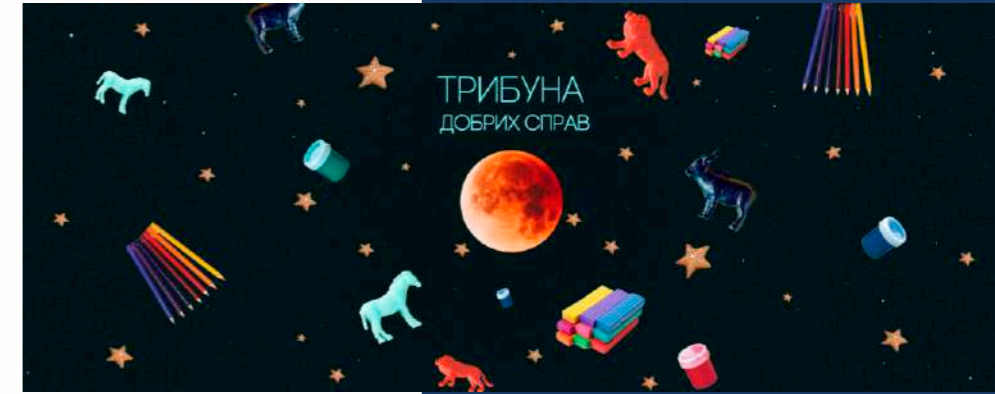
On the website of the channel and its other websites it has become 40% more content related to the issues of IDPs, volunteers, participants and veterans ATO.
